How can I get to college?

By Bus ..

Norwich is served by a number of bus companies - Anglia Coaches, First Bus, KonectBus, Norfolk Green, Sanders Coaches and Simmonds Coaches. There are several bus services that drop off and pick up outside the college on Ipswich Road. All bus services go through the main city bus station located on Surrey Street which is a ten minute walk from the college.

Norfolk County Council Bus Pass - if you:

- are under 19 years of age on 31 August
- live more than three miles from the college
- studying on a full-time course

you are eligible to purchase a Norfolk County Council bus pass. Depending on the household income a contribution of £167 or £334 will be required. This can only be used term-time only and during college hours. Application forms can be obtained from the Advice Shop in A1, by calling the Passenger Transport Unit on 0344 800 8003 or apply on-line at www.norfolk.gov.uk/post16transport

Discounted First Bus passes are available to all college students and staff and can be used anytime ie daytime, evenings, weekends and holiday periods. You can buy a bus pass by going to the Cashiers Office in the Wroxham Building between 9.30am and 4.00pm. You will need to take a passport sized photo with you for the ID card and your CCN student ID. By Park and Ride ...

Harford off A140, Ipswich Road at the junction with A47 southern pass. Buses every 5 minutes peak-time, 7-10 minutes off-peak

Thickthorn B1172, Norwich Road, Hethersett. Buses every 10 minutes, 15 minutes after 1800 hours

Costessey Bawburgh Lane (by Norfolk Showground). Buses every 12 minutes, 15-20 minutes off-peak

By Car ...

Parking on campus is severely limited and costs £3.00 per day, £1.50 after 1.00 pm and free after 5.00 pm. A college validation sticker on the windscreen is essential and is available from Southwell Lodge, main reception or the car park attendant. Students must also display a current pay and display ticket. Wheel clamps are in use on the college premises.

By Train ...

The main Norwich Thorpe station is about 1.5 miles from the college – about a 25 minute walk. However, buses are available at the station into the city centre.
